

Gastric (Stomach) Cancer

Initial work up

- CT Chest and Abdomen and Pelvis
- PET/CT if no distant metastases are seen of CT exams

Restaging

- CT Chest, Abdomen and Pelvis
- PET (optional)

Surveillance imaging

- When clinically indicated (i.e. changing clinical status)
